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BOMA International Officially Launches BOMA Best in US

BOMA BEST certification is officially open to US-based buildings. That unveiling came during the BOMA 2023 Town Hall. A high-level overview by BOMA International and BOMA Canada representatives showed the great potential BOMA BEST has to succeed in the US market, and the ROI that building owners and managers can see when their building achieves BOMA BEST certification.

From I/E IQ to Economic impact

A major topic of conversation at the Town Hall was BOMA International's partnership with IREM and NAA to gather data for a holistic benchmarking tool called the I/E IQ Report. A great discussion with a joint panel of BOMA and IREM representatives illustrated just how powerful the I/E IQ report will be, and the potential the benchmarking tool has to grow. The final report is set to be released in August.

An economic survey from University of Colorado Boulder professor Adam Illig was discussed on a panel that included BOMA International Chair-Elect Bob Six and Vice Chair Manny Moreno. The report showed concrete data about office buildings' economic impact, including management, maintenance and repair, servicing, and utilities. A survey of all 85 markets that have a BOMA International presence revealed that the 8.6 billion square feet of office space directly equates to \$135 billion in spending and employes nearly 854,000 workers.

Advocacy Department Releases Report on Electrification in Commercial Buildings

The BOMA International Advocacy Staff has released an insightful report on the benefits and challenges of electrification.
